
About



The Digital Development Partnership (DDP) is a partnership between the World Bank and public and private sector partners to help developing countries accelerate green, resilient, and inclusive digitalization. DDP's support of analytical and advisory services helps shape the global digital agenda and support client countries in the formulation and execution of their digital transformation strategies, underpinned by significant World Bank Group development financing. Strategic priority areas include (1) broadband connectivity, access, and use; (2) digital data infrastructure; (3) ICT industry and digital jobs; (4) digital safeguards; (5) digital for climate; (6) accelerating digital across sectors. Since its inception in 2016, the DDP portfolio has reached over \$37 million supporting 120+ grants in more than 80 countries around the world. Funds disbursed by the DDP have leveraged a record of \$10.7 billion in World Bank lending.



The Cybersecurity Multi-Donor Trust Fund was launched in 2021 as a special initiative under the DDP Umbrella to provide knowledge, technical assistance, and practical tools to help build cyber and digital security capability and capacity. Activities help countries develop and implement strategies that allow them to take advantage of the opportunities of the digital age while safeguarding their infrastructure against cyber risk, leveraging lending operations for both investment needs and institutional strengthening. This initiative also supports expanding global cybersecurity knowledge and evidence and contributes to fostering global policy coherence.

» Digital Data Infrastructure

Data is a key economic asset providing unprecedented opportunities for development. The social and economic value of data can be maximized by scaling up investment in data infrastructure and services, strengthening data governance, and developing integrated data management infrastructure, platforms, and analytical capabilities.

» Digital for Climate Change

Digital innovation offers potentially game-changing opportunities for a green transition, while the greening of digital technologies itself is critical to achieve digitalization in a sustainable way. A partnership approach is necessary to help close the enormous gaps in financing of green digital infrastructure in developing countries.

» Bridging the Digital Divide

Narrowing the gap in access, adoption, and usage of digital technologies, data, and services will entail reducing affordability, cultural, and physical barriers, and utilizing digital tools to expand access to markets, employment, and educational opportunities for all. Greater collaboration between the public and private sectors is key to closing the digital divide.

Harnessing the full potential of digitalization requires strong partnerships with the private sector. The session will explore the role that the private sector plays in supporting developing countries in their digital transformation journeys and explore effective engagement modalities with the private sector in the new development context.
